Ensure there is good oral pressure during sound production. Establish new motor speech patterns that replace speech sound errors.

Worldwide, oral clefts in any form (i.e., cleft lip, cleft lip and palate, or isolated cleft palate) occur in about one in every 700 live births (World Health Organization [WHO], 2001).

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International estimates that are limited to cleft lip with or without cleft palate range from 7.94 to 9.92 per 10,000 live births (IPDTC, 2011; Tanaka, Mahabir, Jupiter, & Menezes, 2012).
