If there are two next to each other, that indicates the back side of a sleeve or armhole. NotchSymbols, or markings used on a pattern to indicate cutting lines, joining points, hems, dart legs, etc. IMPORTANT:Single notches alwaysrefer to the front of a pattern and a double notch alwaysrefers to the back of a pattern. A pattern notcheris an ideal tool for the job. However, a single line or triangle will do the job.

The outer edge of the pattern is where you're supposed to cut. It's usually marked with a solid black line. If the pattern is multi-sized, each size will have its own type of line—usually dashes of varying lengths.

Check the pattern directions for more specific marking needs. Construction Markings Seamline: This broken line, usually 5/8" (or desired seam allowance) from the cutting line indicates where to join the pieces. Many patterns, especially multi-size ones, do not have seamlines drawn on the patterns. Small Arrows are on some seamlines to indicate stitching direction.

When it comes to marking notches I think the easiest and clearest way is to clip your seams. When your pattern and fabric are still pinned together, simple cut directly over the top of your notches through the pattern and fabric. Do not cut the entire width of the seam allowance, this is a short snip roughly 1/4"/5mm or less long.
